

Effective January 1, 2015

Notary Consumer Disclosure Requirement (SB 1050)

Effective **January 1, 2015**, pursuant to Senate Bill 1050, the Santa Cruz County Recorder's Office will require the Notary Consumer Disclosure. This bill requires a legible notice at the top of the certificate of acknowledgement in an enclosed box. Documents where the person appeared before a notary or other officer on or after **January 1, 2015** must have this disclosure or it will be rejected. Documents acknowledged before **January 1, 2015** will be accepted for recording and must meet current applicable statute.

To assist in prompt recording of your document (s) please be sure to use the exact sample given below with regard to legibility, exact wording and format.

(e) A certificate for acknowledgement taken within this state shall be in the following form:

A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document.
