


What Area Are We Talking About?

- CSA 9E is the area in pink on the map. CSA stands for County Service Area.
- It includes 1,600 street trees and approximately 25 miles of sidewalks
- CSA 9E was formed in 1991 to provide streetscape maintenance services in the former Live Oak/Soquel Redevelopment Project Area.
- It is funded by a small assessment fee paid by residents on their property taxes.



Buying Power of the Fund Has Plummeted.

A dollar now only buys 53% of what it could back in 1997. Meanwhile, the trees are bigger, the sidewalks are older, and Santa Cruz County has become the most expensive rental market in the Country.





Why Can't the County Divert Money from Somewhere Else?

What would you cut? Sheriff service? Rural road maintenance? Also, it's important to understand the nature of a County Service Area (CSA). CSAs can be formed by residents who wish to pay for extra services in their local area.


- There are 36 private road CSAS
- Sanitation CSAs provide septic for groups of homes
- CSA 48 pays for County Fire for rural, unincorporated areas
- CSA 3 Road median maintenance, beach access maintenance, patrol and litter control services for Aptos Seascape

If CSA 9E fixes its budget shortfall by taking money from the County General Fund, why shouldn't these other CSAs do the same as well? The result would quickly lead to financial disaster.




Proposed


Coastal Vulnerability Assessment

- Coastal Commission (CC) Rejected
 County's Local Coastal Program Amendment
- 2. CC awarded County \$780K for a sea level rise vulnerability assessment
- 3. Extensive outreach component coming soon.



Moran Lake Restoration and Access

- Draft Moran Lake Restoration and Access Plan expected this Fall.
- 2. Area supports considerable portion of overwintering Monarch population (5% statewide)
- 3. Facilities improvements will be incorporated into the plan as well.




Vacation Rentals

- 3. Hired full-time Code Compliance Officer dedicated to vacation rental issues.




