# II. ADDITIONS/CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

Announcement by the Chair that Commissioner Bruce has resigned.

The Commission requested a brief update/summary of County response to storm damage with respect to climate change and increasing resilience. Staff provided an update that the short-term response to the emergency generally involves mitigating the immediate threat to public and private infrastructure and repairing damage as fast as possible to reestablish roadway, utilities, drainage systems function. Declared disasters also lead to availability of federal and state hazard mitigation grant funding to study and implement longer term solutions and resilience measures such as evacuation route planning, communications systems improvements, and fire and flood hazard mitigation.
