<p>Workplan</p> <p>In order to work with the COE to build local capacity for school-based COVID-19 outbreak prevention and control to achieve in-person K-12, Public Health will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Form a Schools Hub Branch to coordinate all internal partner support of schools and COE: Vaccine Branch, Testing Branch, Outreach & Engagement, PIO, Call Center, Emergency Preparedness, and Epidemiology. The Schools Hub Director will act as primary liaison to COE. •Create a School Support Squad of dedicated Communicable Disease staff to respond to all contact tracing and outbreak response needs. The School Support Squad will work directly with school nurses, health clerks, and administrators on response and mitigate, and will also support all SPOT reporting questions. <p>Metrics - ALL METRICS MET</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Institute weekly internal School Hubs meeting by September 1, 2021 •Participate in weekly COE leadership meetings by June 30, 2022 •Submit quarterly AB86 grant reports on grant expenditure and types and totals of technical assistance provided to schools and the COE. Final report due July 15, 2022. •Attend 2-3 weekly CDPH Safe Schools For All Initiative (SS4A) calls, providing policy and guideline review and update.
