## **DISASTER RECOVERY CENTERS TO CLOSE**

Disaster Recovery Centers staffed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and Small Business Administration are closing on Thursday, March 30<sup>th</sup>. The County encourages those who wish to speak with in-person representatives regarding ongoing appeals or who have received letters from requesting additional information to visit prior to that date.

After March 30<sup>th</sup>, support is available via telephone or online. Contact <a href="https://www.DisasterAssistance.gov">https://www.DisasterAssistance.gov</a>, call 800-621-FEMA (3362), or use the FEMA app for assistance.

On Jan. 14, 2023, President Biden approved a Major Disaster Declaration for winter storms that devastated Santa Cruz County between Dec. 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022, and Jan. 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023. The deadline to apply for individual or other assistance for those storms was March 16.

DRCs are located in Santa Cruz at the County Governmental Building, 701 Ocean St., Santa Cruz, and in Watsonville at the City Government Center, 250 Main St., Watsonville. The Santa Cruz DRC is open from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. The Watsonville DRC is open 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.
