Libraries available as Cooling Sites to Beat the Heat

The National Weather Service has issued an excessive heat warning for parts of Santa Cruz County for this weekend. As temperatures rise, the Santa Cruz Public Libraries (SCPL) and the Santa Cruz County Office of Response, Recovery, and Resilience (OR3) want to remind the community that library branches are open and available as cool and safe spaces for members of the public to seek refuge from the heat.

All Library branches are open regularly Monday through Thursday 10am to 6pm and Friday through Saturday 10am to 5pm. Additionally, the Capitola and Downtown branch libraries are open Sundays 1pm to 5pm.

The libraries are well-equipped with air conditioning and ample seating areas, providing visitors with a safe escape from the heat. The libraries also offer a range of resources and services, including access to books, magazines, Wi-Fi, and educational materials, ensuring an enjoyable and productive time for all visitors.

During extreme heat, OR3 advises residents to stay hydrated and take cooling breaks, limit outdoor activities during the afternoon and evening, wear sunscreen if they will be outdoors and never leave pets or children unattended in vehicles.
